GOLF OVERSIGHT ADVISOR REPORT FEBRUARY 21 20204

Joann Zornow was absent and Nancy Perusse gave the following report for her:

Report by Brian Bagwell; The ground crew will start working on treating the greens next month. They will also start sanding the greens. The driving range mats have arrived and they will start putting them in place soon. Some work is needed to be done before some of this can be finished. When finished they will last longer. They can be rotated so there isn't ware on just one place. They will also have places to put tees in. I gave Brian a note about putting out of bound markers on hole #1 and hole #9 at Eagle Crest. Some of our members have noticed they are missing on those two holes.

Report by Donny Long: The cancellation program is working well. He suggested that if you are not able to get a tee time to keep checking because people are canceling. Especially between 3 and 4 p.m. the day before you want to play.

Last month's rounds of golf were down by 588, but the revenue was up by \$13,000.00 because of the price of outside play.

Super Bowl weekend was not as good as expected probably due to weather and low outside play.

Jim Neighbors reported that the golf clinics and demo days are very popular and fill up fast.

The city is willing to place additional signage in the medians at all golf cart crossings so that drivers on the roadway can see the signs better. Not sure when that will happen.

Report by Mitzi: She talked about the budget which will be done in March. There will be no golf oversight committee meeting in March because of the budget meeting.

HANDICAP CHAIR'S REPORT: Sue reported: Most improved golfer for January 2024 is Nancy Nelson who dropped her handicap index from 39.3 to 33.8 for an improvement factor of 1.120

Rule for when your ball hits another player's equipment or cart.

Under Rule 11.1 for all accidental deflections, including when the ball hits the player or opponent or their equipment or caddies: There is no penalty and the ball is played as it lies (with limited exceptions).

Rule for marking ball off of the putting surface.

You may ask another player to mark her ball if it interferes with your shot or stance.
