Golf Oversight Meeting January 21, 2026

Board of Directors: no report

NGA: Gerry reported that the semi-annual NGA board met in December. Dues were raised from \$36 to \$37. The merger of NGA and SNGA is official. Rosters must be updated by the end of January to avoid billing issues.

DEPARTMENT DIRECTORS REPORTS

Golf Course Maintenance: Pre-emergent spraying began in January. Brian shared that the golf courses are not subject to the same watering restrictions as residential properties. The drinking fountain at Highland #15 is currently out of order. Task Tracker implementation will begin upon completion of signing the contract.

Golf Play, Income and Programs:

Favorable weather resulted in minimal frost delays, allowing earlier tee times in December and January. December rounds exceeded budget by 865 rounds. Actual 8,730 vs budget 7,805. YTD rounds total was 54,774 which is 4,599 rounds above budget for the first six months. Nine Wine and Dine starts February 4th.

Executive Director: Mitzi discussed golf courses as an amenity as defined by CC&Rs. She reviewed the master-planned community requirements, including maintenance of flood plains.

NEW BUSINESS:

(Discussion Only) Donny introduced Tyler O'Connor from Bird Golf private lesson program. Student 9-hole green fees \$50. Food and beverage \$30 per person. (includes instructor). Instruction provided by PGA and LPGA professional. Director Mills recommended the Bird Golf proposal be brought to the Board for a vote.
